***“Jesus . . . revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.” (John 2:11)***

Jesus’ first miracle was impressive: he turned water into wine. Because it happened at a marriage celebration, you might consider this a special wedding gift for the happy couple. But it was also a miracle performed so that his disciples would see his glory and “believe in him” (John 2:11).

John tells us that this was the first sign that Jesus performed. Then he goes on to recount six more signs, each of which is meant to deepen his disciples’ faith—and ours as well. Each sign tells us that when we place our faith in him, he sets us on a path of renewal. He takes our plain, everyday “water” and turns it into choice “wine.”

What do the other signs tell us? That Jesus’ words have the power to heal us (John 4:46-54; 5:1-9). That he wants to feed us with his Living Bread and calm the storms and anxieties in our hearts (6:1-21). That he wants to open our eyes to see him as the Lord who loves us (9:1-7, 35-39). And that he wants to raise us from our “tombs” of sin and doubt and unbelief (11:1-44).

All of these stories point to God’s work of restoring and renewing what is lacking. They tell us that God wants to restore in us the joy of worship and to become for us the source of all blessing.

When you hear this passage proclaimed at Mass today, think about the ways in which you need to be renewed. Maybe Jesus wants to renew your zeal for him or your love for your spouse or your desire to pray. Believe that God is always at work in you, bringing back to life what has been languishing. Just as he did at Cana, he wants to supply you with the choicest of wines. And in the process, he wants to show you his glory.

*“Thank you, Jesus, for renewing me. Lord, help me to see your glory so that I can believe in you more deeply.”*

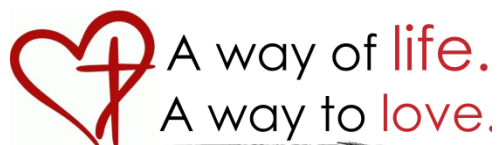

**BIBLE VERSE OF THIS WEEK:**

**"Do whatever he tells you." (John 2:5)**



**"Do whatever he tells you!"**

Mary is recorded as speaking only four times in all four Gospels [175 words]. First is her exchange with the angel at the Annunciation [Luke 1:34, 38]; next, when she visits Elizabeth and proclaims the *Magnificat* [Luke 1:46-55]; then when she confronts and chastises Jesus for staying behind in Jerusalem [Luke 2:48]. Mary's last words in the Bible are at the wedding feast at Cana. She tells Jesus "They have no more wine" and then instructs the

servants, “Do whatever he tells you!” [John 3:4]. Mary is a woman of few words, but they are powerful. From “May it be done unto me according to your word” to “Do whatever he tells you!” she gives us a model of faith, courage and openness to the will of God. She challenges us to listen to Jesus in prayer and to “do whatever he tells you.” to become all that God created us to be. What is that “woman of a few words” telling us today? Probably: **“Do whatever he tells you!”**

## PERPETUAL CARE - FOR PEACE OF MIND

Perpetual Care is a service offered to you by the Office of Cemeteries of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux.

### - WHAT IS ELIGIBLE?

Tombs, slabs and vaults constructed of concrete, marble or granite are all potentially eligible for perpetual care.

### - WHAT IS COVERED?

Cleaning of stone, re-grouting of stone joints, cleaning and/or painting of cement finishes when needed in judgment of cemetery, repairs to roof, and such other work that may be required to maintain the memorial in good condition; including also care and maintenance of aisles and roadways leading to the memorial.

### - HOW DO I GET IT?

Contact the Cemetery Office where your family burial is located or the Diocesan Office of Cemeteries (446-0280) for your no-obligation, no-charge proposal.

Having a family burial location gives you peace of mind; having perpetual care relieves others of the burdens of maintenance.
